## On-Site Unfield Trips

The Amazeum will continue to host school groups for Unfield Trip experiences on-site at a limited capacity. New safety requirements are in place to provide a safe and healthy learning experience for students and guests in the museum\*.

- ▶ Guests ages 10 and older are required to wear face coverings inside and outside the museum.
- ▶ Frequent hand washing and sanitizing is encouraged.
- ▶ Capacity is limited and guests are asked to be smart and play 6 feet apart.
- ▶ School groups will not be able to bring lunches into the museum during Unfield Trips.
